The Role

Sampad is looking to recruit at least 20 volunteers who can help us with the Parade. We would expect volunteers to attend all training to fully understand their role, tasks required and health & safety issues. Below are the two different areas you could be involved in:

Rangeeli Colours of Birmingham Parade	Sat 23 rd Sept 2017 Parade starts at 11am but we would need you to be there at: 9am (time subject to change)	The colours of Birmingham come to life in this spectacular city-wide parade, featuring a vibrant array of hand-held puppets, flags, masks, costumes and an amazing, life-size mechanical elephant called Harminder, along with Dhol and Brazilian beats, exhilarating South Asian, African and contemporary dance and a kaleidoscope of <i>Patang</i> kites! The parade will be split into different continents and this will be a challenging role to get performers to the right place at the right time and then walking through town to Victoria Square.
Square Dance	Sat 23 rd Sept 2017 The Square Dance starts at 12 noon but we would need you to be there at: 10am (time subject to change)	The Rangeeli Colours of Birmingham parade culminates at Square Dance on Victoria Square with a crescendo of sound including Dhol and Brazilian beats, exhilarating dance styles in the form of kathakali, Bollywood, bhangra, bharatanatyam and African and contemporary moves. This is a mainly backstage role getting people and equipment ready for the performance

Commitment & Training sessions

Saturday 9th September (MORNING) or Tuesday 12th September (EVENING)

There is also a drop in/meet and greet with Birmingham Weekender staff on 22nd August 2017, 5-7pm at the Community Hub in John Lewis for all Birmingham Weekender volunteers, which you are welcome to attend if you would like.

The Sampad volunteer team will then meet together after the training on the evening of 12th September 2017 to go through Parade specific details.

Can I apply?
